





ASTT Annual Conference 2025

to be held at Hopetown, Darlington over the weekend of 4th- 5th Oct 2025 Call for Bookings and Fee Payments

Plans are finalised for our 2025 conference to be held at Hopetown Museum, McNay St, Darlington DL3 6SW over the weekend of 4th-5th October. 2025.

This will be our 10th conference and will follow the successful format of earlier ones, with a series of presentations, a conference dinner and a chance to see locomotives close-up.

The conference will follow the general format of previous conferences with 1½ days of presentations, a conference dinner on the Saturday evening and two loco viewing sessions on the Sunday – viz: P2, No. 2007 *Prince of Wales* at the A1 Trust's Darlington Locomotive Works in the morning and the *Titans of Steam* exhibition in the afternoon (see below).

This year's focus is on the "Continuing Operation of Steam" into the 21st Century: - operations, maintenance and new-build steam.

This year is Rail 200, so our venue is the refurbished Hopetown Museum in Darlington and we have two North East-based speakers: -

- Paul Middleton (aka Piglet) of the North Yorkshire Moors Railway
- Daniela Filova, founder and owner of Daniela Works Ltd, provider of technical services to the railway heritage sector.

- Private viewing of the A1 Trust P2 'Prince of Wales'

For anyone travelling to Darlington on the Friday, how about arriving early and having a leisurely look round the refurbished museum? They will be hosting two special exhibitions both of which end on Sunday 5/10/25:

S&DR200 Presents: STEAM to the Future - Free

A family friendly exhibition, following Railway Pioneers: Celebrating the Railway Rockstars of the Past, transports you from the present and into the beyond. The exhibition takes a playful look at the near and BlueSky thinking showcasing the design and science behind the rail industry.

S&DR200 has commissioned an immersive installation by **A.A.Murakami** (AKA Studio Swine) inspired by steam as a source of power, and the chance to create a 22nd century inspired locomotive using virtual reality software.

All of our railway contributors are looking to the future and this is a glimpse into just some of the work that is underway to ensure the railways continue for another 200 years and how the rail industry is gearing up for a second revolution driven by the growing green technologies sector in the Tees Valley and County Durham.

Experiment! - £5

Is an extraordinarily vivid journey into passenger rail travel. Starting right here in Darlington in 1825 with Locomotion No. 1's first steam-powered passenger railway journey, take an exciting ride into the past to discover more about the history of the railways, and imagine where they will take us in the future! See the impact Darlington's railway heritage has had across societies and cultures across time and around the world.

This is a simulator-style ride for which there is a £5 charge.
